



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What are my Future options?



After you finish school, there's a whole wide world of options out there for you. Maybe you want to study. Maybe you want to travel. But how do you know what the right choice is for you? Well, you've got lots of options. And if one pathway doesn't quite fit, there's bound to be another. *Let's take a look.*

UNIVERSITY

This is probably what most people think of when they're asked about what they want to do after school. University is a great option if you have a career in mind and know what you need to study to get there (for example, if you want to be a doctor, you're going to have to study medicine). Most students finish Year 12 and use their ATAR to gain entry to university. But this is far from the only way. There are a ton of alternative pathways you can take if your first option doesn't work out (take a look at some here: <u>https://studyworkgrow.com.au/alternativepathways/</u>

TAFE/VET

Speaking of study, uni isn't your only option. Vocational Training and Education (or VET) is a great way to get skilled for work, often in a much shorter time frame than university. Most VET courses don't have any entry requirements either, so you don't need to stress about results. And if you decide you do want to study at uni one day, you can use your VET qualification for entry. You could even combine work and study by doing an <u>apprenticeship</u> or traineeship.

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<u>WORK</u>

Maybe you don't want to do anymore study, and that's okay too. There are lots of jobs out there that you don't need a qualification to jump into. Or you could start at the bottom and work your way up – maybe you've had your retail job for a while, and there's an opportunity to become manager. Even better, you might come up with the next big idea and start your own business. You might even find that you can access some pathways you thought you'd need a degree for – but this will usually take lots and lots of time and experience.

GAP YEAR

Not quite sure what you want to do just yet? That's totally fine! You can always take some time off to evaluate your options and spend time growing as a person. Traditionally people take a gap year to travel, though this changed a bit thanks to COVID. Luckily, lots of travel and exchange programs are opening back up. You can combine your travel with work, or just get out there and have some great experiences. Even if you don't want to travel, there's so much you can do - you could volunteer, pick up a new hobby, learn a new language, build your soft skills... The list is nearly endless. COMBINE YOUR OPTIONS

You might've already figured this out, but one of the best (and most common) things to do is combine your options. While you're studying, you might like to get a casual or part-time job. If you want to work full-time, you could upskill with microprograms or short courses that won't take time out of your busy day. Pick up a job while you travel overseas. Get a VET qualification, then use it to get into uni. Take some time off to rest and relax, then start studying mid-year. The options out there are nearly endless! And if you don't end up liking the pathway you've chosen? You can always try a different one. Even if it's after six months, or twenty years down the track. Wherever you want to go, there's probably more than one pathway you can take to get there.

CAREERS & PATHWAYS

There are at least 10 Rural Chances scholarships valued at \$5000 on offer to assist young people to move away from their hometown or to assist with extensive travel required to complete TAFE (Certificate III or above, including Apprenticeships) training qualifications. Additionally, there are at least 10 smaller scholarships of up to \$2000 available for specific items to support training.

To meet the eligibility criteria applicants will need to:

- Be 16-24 years of age
- Hold a current Centrelink health care card, or can provide evidence of significant financial hardship
- Identify a TAFE qualification (Certificate III or above) they would like to enrol in or are enrolled in OR an apprenticeship they would like to undertake
- Be planning to train in a skill area where there are skills shortages in rural/regional Victoria
- Be willing to have a mentor supporting their learning
- Be willing to be accountable for the scholarship funds
- Be willing to participate in publicity/promotional material and research.

Applications for Rural Chances Scholarships open on September 5th and Close October 27th, 2022.

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Accommodation Options for Universities/TAFE

Now is the time to be applying for on campus accommodation for next year. Some applications will have a cost, but it is well worth applying and paying now to reduce the panic of trying to find accommodation at the last minute. Living on campus gives students the opportunity to meet others from a range of subject areas, locations in Victoria and Australia and a chance to make new friendships. It takes the stress out of having to travel to university each day, all have excellent public transport options and allows students to form study groups on residence. Some even have scholarships to help reduce the costs. Most on campus accommodation includes utilities, heating, internet access, shared kitchen, lounge, laundry and common areas with activities such as table tennis, pool, a gym and offer links to sporting and extra-curricular events and activities.

If studying in Melbourne at any of the tertiary institutions (including privately run institutions) there are several private student residences available. A good starting point is the link for RMIT.
