Principal's Report

Hats

There are shaded areas for use if no hat is being worn – outside the canteen, the verandah under the Tech building, the sand pit

for the smaller students.

Transition

Our Foundation transition started today. The kindergarten children visited the school and stayed until recess time. Their next visit is the 26th of October then the last visit will be on the 9th November.

Year 12 students' Last Day

The last day for Year 12 students to be at school is Wednesday 19th October. We will celebrate with Year 12 on this day before they leave to start their preparation for exams, which start on Wednesday 26th October. The Year 12 Dinner will be held on Tuesday 15th November at the Memorial Hall.

Irrigation

After many years of planning and saving, our irrigation project is ready to start. With new pipes going in around the school oval, the oval will be out of bounds from the beginning of November. Other works will be done over the January holidays to ensure sprinklers etc. are in the garden beds. Come the return to school next year it should all be finished and automated.

Thanks go to the Buildings and Grounds Committee for all the work in preparation of documents and plans and to the Parents' Club for their donations towards the project over the last years. Also, thanks to Lois Mitchell for the hours spent watering the grounds over summer (including holidays). This has been many years in the planning, so it is good to see it finally come to fruition.

School procedures for the bushfire season (with updated fire risk ratings)

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Catastrophic (Code Red) fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district.

Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Where possible, we will provide parents with 24 hours notice of a potential Catastrophic (Code Red) day closure by letter and SMS. A Catastrophic (Code Red) day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Catastrophic (Code Red) day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic (Code Red) fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- As a bus co-ordinating school all bus routes will be cancelled.

On these Catastrophic (Code Red) days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – **on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.**

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Catastrophic (Code Red) days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic (Code Red) day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan, we regularly inspect trees and clear out potential hazards. Gutters are checked and any maintenance needed is carried out.


What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters and keeping an eye on email – Xuno will be our quickest method of contact.

- Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

The new Fire Danger Ratings



There are four levels of fire danger in the new system:

- **Moderate** - Plan and prepare
- **High** - Be ready to act
- **Extreme** - Take action now to protect your life and property
- **Catastrophic** - For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas



This year's judges were very impressed with the way entrants produced their artwork to the themes and the network would like to congratulate all participants in the competition, and announce the following winners from Boort District School:



The Bringing Up Great Kids program supports parents and carers to explore:

- Learn more about the origins of their own parenting style and how it can be more effective.
- Consider the relationship between a child's stage of neurological development and their behaviour.
- Identify important messages they want to convey to their child and how to achieve this.
- Understand the messages that children communicate to their parents and how they do this.
- Discover how to overcome some of the obstacles that are getting in the way of being the kind of parent they would like to be.
- Learn about the importance of building self-esteem in children.
- Discover ways for parents to take care of themselves and to find support when they need it.

Overview

A parenting program for building good relationships with children. The Bringing Up Great Kids parent program is a fun 6-week group that focuses on how parents communicate with their children. It offers opportunities for parents to learn about how children understand and use messages from their parents in their own development. This parenting program combines a reflective mindfulness based approach to parenting with a focus on the emotional and developmental needs of children.



TERTIARY ACCESS PAYMENT

Financial help for outer regional or remote students to help with the cost of moving for tertiary study. The Tertiary Access Payment is a payment of \$5,000. It's to help eligible students with the cost of moving to study. This is for study after you've finished year 12. Students can claim the payment via Services Australia (Centrelink) in their first year of study.

To be eligible for the Tertiary Access Payment you need to meet some rules. These include:

- moving from an outer regional or remote area for tertiary study (moving at least 90 minutes from home via public transport)
- starting tertiary study directly after finishing year 12 (with no gap year)
- Studying a Certificate IV or above
