# WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS/GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. The survey is optional but we encourage all families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

### All families are invited to participate in the survey.

The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September 2023.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

Survey results will be communicated to parents/caregivers/guardians through annual reporting.

All information for accessing the survey will be sent out via email next week. We look forward to hearing from you.





### **OE4 Merrijig and Lake Mountain Camp**

Two weeks ago, students from Year 12 Outdoor & Environmental Studies attended a camp to the Victorian High Country. We first travelled to Merrijig to take part in a Horse Trail Ride with Mountain Valley Trail Rides and the McCormack family, a 7-generation alpine grazing family. This was a great opportunity for students to experience horse riding including creek crossings, steep rocky slopes and muddy trails which the students loved. We also had the chance to speak with current members of the Mountain Cattleman's Association of Victoria about the Alpine Grazing conflict of the mid-2000's and the current issues that exist around the area in land management. After this we travelled to Taggerty to stay the night and prepare for the next day that involved tobogganing and snow play at Lake Mountain. Though the snow levels were low, students had a fun time on the slope. The location also enabled students to experience an Alpine environment and learn about the effects of climate change on this environment, as well as see some of the management strategies that are being implemented to reduce impacts on the environment.



### **Showcasing Our Health Sector Heroes**

Last Wednesday, saw the culmination of our Youth Takeover work with Boort District Health. Across last term, Vocational Major students were integrated into the working lives of a number of BDH employees. Students were able to develop biographies of these employees and review a range of signage within the workplace. With the coordination of the LLEN, students were exposed to a range of professionals that assisted in creating a video that BDS will use to advertise future employment opportunities. We thank Donna, Mubarak and the staff at BDH for their time and willingness to work with our young people in order to complete their Vocational Major outcomes in a workplace setting. The co-ordination of the project through the LLEN with Ryan, Pam, Manue, Molly and others has contributed significantly to the success of the project. The final celebration, including Braedon's MC role, Josephine's reading of her biography, Austin's lunch offerings and many interested onlookers, was an excellent way to finish!











### **CALDER ATHLETICS**

On a fantastic winter's day at Charlton our F-6 students took part in the annual Calder Athletics Carnival. It is always a great opportunity for students to demonstrate their skills in athletics running, jumping and throwing and this year was no different with our students doing an amazing job. We had lots of excellent performances with several students getting close to perfect scores. These results all came together for us to finish equal second overall in the aggregate competition.

### H2.2 Yung Balug Museum Visit

Students from H2.2 Colonial History class recently visited Paul and Cathie Haw's Temporary Keeping Place, "Yung Balug" Museum on the outskirts of Boort. It was a fantastic opportunity for students to learn about the Dja Dja Wurrung of the area as well as see and feel some of the artefacts of our first nation people including grinding stones, spears, stone axes and baskets.

Below are some of the comments made by students upon our return.

"In Colonial Australia, we went to visit Paul Haw's aboriginal artefact museum to learn about aboriginal history and tools. It was quite interesting seeing all the really old things and hearing about how everything is used and the different stories". - Sophie

"We went to Paul Haw's museum. I loved learning about all the spears and equipment. It was good fun". - Cooper "We went to Paul Haw's aboriginal museum and it was very interesting to look at all of the tools and weapons that he had". - Finlay

"I really enjoyed going to the museum at Paul's house. I like learning about all the different things they did, how they made their tools, what tools they used and how they survived back then". – Jake

"We learnt many things about the Dja Dja Wurrung people and how they made things. Seeing things that they used to hunt animals and make their food and how they lived on the land". - Bella

"It was very interesting to learn about the Dja Dja Wurrung people that lived in Boort. I learnt many things and one of the things that I found interesting was how the scar trees are over 300 years old". – Natalie
