Acting Principal's Report

Litter Habits

As I walked around the football oval with a bin to clean up after the local Grand Final, I reflected on the type of attitudes that somehow make it ok for people to eat, drink and enjoy their day, and then leave their rubbish either where they are sitting or subtly move it behind them and leave it. It's not something that they would do at home probably, or maybe even with family while out and about? The passing on of these attitudes and behaviours from adult to child concerns me and hopefully concerns us all. We often have pride in our school and young people regarding the many skills, volunteering and effort that they put into being a part of the community however, recently, some of our students have made poor decisions regarding how they dispose of their litter. I had an interesting conversation with

my Year 11 and 12 Vocational Major students regarding

how old are young people before they consistently make decisions regarding using a bin, challenging others or cleaning up after them, or simply taking rubbish with them if there is no bin in sight instead of leaving it. The answer was 16 or 17. I challenge our students and the parents of students to be better than this and to do the "right" thing more often regarding litter. It's a pretty simple one to follow if we all get on board!



<u>Bucket Hats – Sun Protection</u>

Australia has often been coined the skin cancer capital of the world. Finding ways to cover our faces, ears and necks during the summer months, especially, is an important habit for all of us to form. At Boort District School, the use of the school bucket hats will assist with early prevention. We ask our parents/carers to ensure that their children have these available and use them at school, instead of bringing peaked caps.

Smile Squad is coming to our school

Dear Boort District P-12 families,

The Smile Squad team from Dental Health Services Victoria are coming to our school. We have tentatively booked for a visit the week starting **Tuesday 17th October** and will add days according to the number of appointments needed.

Smile Squad is the Victorian Government free school dental program.

This means all students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school.

How to access free dental care

We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian. Sign up to Smile Squad at: https://bit.ly/smilesquadvic OR use the QR code:





Please complete and submit the consent form. A small number of paper copies of the consent form are available to those unable to go online. Please contact the school office if you would like to request one.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

Smile Squad dental packs

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens. Your child(ren) will soon/have received a free dental pack to bring home. The dental pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure in a orange water bottle. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life. Our f-6 students have already received their water bottle package as part of Healthy bones week and prior to year 5/6 camp.

Standard strength toothpaste

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.

Dodgeball

In Term 3, students from Year 7 to 12 had the opportunity to participate in an on-going lunch time dodgeball competition. Every year level entered a team in, with the Year 11's entering in two. The competition involved a small home and away season, followed by a knockout finals system in the last two weeks. With lots of entertaining games, ebbing and flowing, we got an epic grand final which crowned our Year 8's champions! Thanks to all the students who got involved and made it a lot of fun!



Unit 2 Outdoor and Environmental Studies

On Monday, the OES class visited different sites in the area to investigate public and private land management. We are very fortunate to have private land purchased by Bush Heritage Australia and Trust for Nature that are preserving and protecting areas deemed significant to the region. Gus Gould from the Loddon Plains Land Care joined us to

















highlight different strategies being done in the area too. First the class visited Buckrabanyule Reserve which was purchased by Bush Heritage Australia in 2021 and students learnt about the biosecurity threat of the Wheel Cactus to agriculture and the initiatives underway to combat the threat. Gus was able to show students the cochineal beetle that has been introduced to the area that eats the cactus and students witnessed evidence of the injection of roundup to kill the cactus. Next, we visited Nardoo Hills Reserve, Lawan site which the Gould family sold to Bush Heritage Australia approximately 10 years ago. This area protects rare grassy woodlands and threatened woodland birds, such as the Mallee fowl, Lawan meaning 'Mallee fowl' in the local Dja Dja Wurrung language. The area has undergone major plant revegetation, and the rain has struck native wildflowers in all their glory. Lastly, we visited Mount Egbert 'Granites' to investigate management strategies, specifically the storm damage/erosion that impacts access to the site and the spread of wheel cactus. Special thanks to Gus Gould for giving up his time to provide his wealth of knowledge of the area.







On Wednesday, the 4th of October we had a visit from St John Ambulance Australia. The F-6 students had the opportunity to participate in first aid sessions. These sessions were informative and fun. The students really enjoyed learning and get to practice apply some first aid. Daisy – I liked the first aid book she
