Year 7 to 9 Mathematics – SQUIZYA Homework Program

Students from Year 7 to Year 9 will be doing their mathematics homework on the sQuizya website. This is the interactive version of the Maths Mate homework program the school has used for many years.

The current Year 7 group, new to the online sQuizya site, have been given their login details and have worked on completing the first task during class time.

There are eight homework tasks per term and at times extra homework may be set on class work being covered. Weekly homework tasks will be added by staff and results communicated through Xuno reporting.



Due dates for each level:

- Year 7 homework will be due by 9:00am on Thursday each week.
- Year 8 homework will be due by 8:00am on Thursday each week.
- Year 9 homework will be due on Wednesday by 8:00am each week. Homework Expectations for Students
- Done at home/outside school time before the due date, **to the best of vour ability**
 - o Do as much as you can without a calculator it will make you better
- Seek assistance with tricky questions
 - o If you have tried and been unable to finish the sheet by the due date and you choose to attend homework help, make sure you **have attempted all questions** and are coming in with only a few to go through
- Use working out paper or your maths book
 - o The questions are only getting harder from here some will not be solvable in your head
- Read and process the instant feedback on sQuizya.

Advantages of sQuizya

- Instant feedback detailed explanation of methods and concepts Accessible anywhere can't lose a sheet
- Covers all topics at a Year level not just the one you're currently learning in class
 - o Revision
 - o Pre-loading information
- What if we haven't done a topic in class yet?
 - o sQuizya instant feedback will tell you how to do it next time
 - o Google is your friend each question tells you the topic it is on

Approving and paying for Events and Fees for Parents

Online Event Approval:

This option is only available for an event if your school has enabled it. A verification code will be sent to your mobile number. If your mobile is not correct, you will need to contact your school to change it. Who can pay for and approve events *or fees*?

Only parents <u>who the school has allowed</u> can approve an event online. Online approval is only possible if your school has enabled this option for the event. In this case, an SMS with a 6-digit verification code will be sent to the parent's mobile number to confirm the approval. <u>Payments can be split between primary and secondary families, in consultation with your school</u>.


Due dates for Events & Fees:


Viewing events and fees in the Parent Portal

- If there are events or fees with overdue approvals, forms or payments, click View in the red band.






Upcoming events will show in your Calendar on the Dashboard. The Payments section shows all


Pay for the Event/Fee

- 3. Enter any additional information required for the Event and click Save.




4. Read the Approval details and click Approve
