Our NAPLAN tests have been completed for another year and I can assure you that the information we receive from the results is incredibly important for our planning. It should also be pointed out that the importance that is placed on these Numeracy and Literacy tests reflect how important building strong literacy and numeracy skills are for young people. They are the foundations to nearly all of

our learning. I am pleased to report that our students did a terrific job of focusing in on their tasks for their NAPLAN tests, which will give us confidence that the results that we analyse are valid and a good reflection of student achievement at that point of time.






ICT Acceptable Use Agreement

UNIT 3 OES OTWAYS CAMP

Last week, students from Unit 3/4 Outdoor & Environmental Studies attended a 3-Day camp to the Otway Forest, Cape Otway and Apollo Bay. We had amazing weather over the trip as students engaged in a variety of activities. Our trip began with driving the first section of the Great Ocean Road taking in the amazing cliffs and winding roads to Lorne via Eastern View, before taking on the adventurous challenges of Lorne Live Wire Park's high ropes course and zipline to analyse risk and adventure's impact on our relationships with the environment. We then headed west to Marengo to setup camp and explore the Apollo Bay harbour.



On our second day, we visited Blanket Bay, Parker Inlet, Point Franklin and Crayfish Bay along Cape Otway looking at the current environment and how it would have looked historically along with some rock pooling. We then travelled north to Beech Forest for an exploration of the Beech Forest Historical Society displays before enjoying e-biking around Beech Forest and investigating the history of the area around settlement and the current state of the environment. After a long day we returned through the ancient Otway Forest visiting the Otway Redwoods and Hopetoun Falls along the way.





For our final day we took part in some sea kayaking. Unfortunately, the wind was a little too strong to go and visit the seals at Marengo this year, so instead we paddled out through the surf beach at Apollo Bay into the harbour and the proceeded to catch some great waves on the way back in. Despite many capsizes in the process of surfing waves, it was an enjoyable way to finish our camp.

Overall, we had a great trip and brought back plenty of knowledge and experiences to apply to future assessments and exams at the end of the year. A big thank you to Sarah Featherby for her assistance on camp.


