### **North Central LLEN**

Recently some students in our school (and other surrounding schools) participated in a survey as part of a youth led research project on 'How work works'. This project was a collaboration between the four Loddon Campaspe LLENs and was funded by the Loddon Campaspe Regional Partnership.

The report has been finalised, was launched, and formally received on behalf of Minister Jaclyn Symes by Danielle Green MP- Parliamentary Secretary for Regional Victoria on Thursday October 22<sup>nd</sup> via a Zoom event.

### **Unit 2 OES**

On Monday 26<sup>th</sup> October the unit 2 OES students investigated a range of public land reserves and wetland environments. Students visited; Leaghur State Park, Lake Meran, Lake Murphy, Reedy Lake, Middle Lake, Lake Charm and Lake Tutchewop. The class gained an understanding of the purpose and importance of each wetland, the natural features, management strategies, flora and fauna and threats to the wetland environments. Some of the lakes visited are classified as Victorian listed RAMSAR wetlands, important for conserving wetland environments.

### **Outdoor Education practical skills**

The Year 9 Outdoor Education class displayed excellent leadership skills last week, working with the Year 6 class to demonstrate how to put up and take down the set of school tents. The Year 9's instructed the Year 6 students to teach them in a lead up to their camp to Swan Hill later this month. It was great to see a mix of students working together so positively.



### **Technology Requirements 2021**

From 2021, the school will not be requiring iPad purchase and use for its Year 5-12 students. While iPads are seen as a secondary device, we are asking that all Year 5-12 students have access to a Laptop computer. The school aims for a 1-1, student to laptop ratio. As part of this, all Year 5 to 12 students are required to supply their own laptop for use at school. This is referred to as the BYOD program (Bring Your Own Device). The Victorian Curriculum Digital Technologies curriculum delivery is also enhanced through student use of these devices. The school is unable to fund and supply quality technology for daily and ongoing student use.

This letter provides an early indication of Technology requirements at Boort District School.

In 2021, Boort District P-12 School will be using the following structure to ensure Technology provision for students in Years F-12:

**Foundation - Year 4** – Years 1, 2, 3, 4 and Foundation students will be asked to "Bring Your Own Device" (BYOD), supplying an Apple iPad or iPad mini.

**Year 5 -12** – Years 5 to 12 students will be asked to "Bring Your Own Device" (BYOD), supplying a Laptop. Students will also have class access to a bank of iPads in specific classes if required. An iPad should only be used as a secondary device.

Updating devices – students will be encouraged to update devices on a regular basis eg. when the warranty expires or perhaps 4/5 years of use.

Please note the information on the school website under BYOD, and the attached material, regarding purchasing options and recommended minimum specifications. A flowchart of requirements at each level is also included below. You have the option to select a Laptop package, based on cost and performance, and the information on the purchase of the iPads. There is also a finance option available through the ZipMoney finance company.

Microsoft Office is used throughout the school and all students are eligible to receive a free copy of Microsoft Office 365, as they will have an education based email account. There will be instructions on the school website and support will be available early in the 2021 school year to help students load this onto their computers if required.

We remind parents / carers / students of the school's Acceptable Use Policy, which needs to be completed and returned to the school in order to enable students to access the network and WiFi. The school's Bullying and Harassment Policy, on the school website, also covers our response to Cyberbullying. The Acceptable Use Policy will be forwarded at a later date.


We understand that there may be situations that arise where provision of these devices is difficult. In these cases, we have a limited amount of machines to loan to students. An ICT levy payment will be required in these cases so that the technology can be serviced and updated. Please contact Merryn Rees to discuss further if required.

We urge parents / carers to have students organised for the beginning of the 2021 school year, with access to laptops required for Year 5-12 students.

<u>Year 5:</u> Students will begin the BYOD Laptop program and will have access to a class bank of iPads.

<u>Year 6:</u> Students continue using their BYOD Laptop and will have access to a class bank of iPads.

<u>Year 7:</u> Students continue using their BYOD Laptop and will have access to a class bank of iPads.

<u>Year 8-11:</u> Students continue using their BYOD Laptop and will have access to a class bank of iPads.

<u>Year 12:</u> Students continue using their BYOD Laptop and will have access to a class bank of iPads.

Boort District School wants students to have a good BYOD setup that will be reliable, supported and will last. As a school, we encourage the purchasing of devices that will have the physical capabilities (including warranty) to be usable and functional in both the home and classroom environment for many years. We understand that purchasing ICT equipment is not always an easy or cheap option/decision for students and their parents. Computing requirements, capabilities and their options can become complex and overwhelming which is not a situation we want our school community to be in.

We are providing a list of suggested specifications for both Notebooks and iPads that we hope will help to inform parents and students about what are key features to look for when choosing appropriate devices from any supplier. The suggested specs are aimed at devices which will last for a minimum of 3 years, but the unlimited number of computer combinations and individual usage can allow for lower spec machines to be more useful, compatible and, potentially, have a longer life.

For parents/families that wish to have an easier option when purchasing a device for their child, Boort District School has partnered with Edunet to provide a BYOD Portal that has a small selection of devices that the school knows will work in school/classroom
